

Past Events

- 4th annual Holiday Cheer event: NUSNA adopted five families this past holiday season. We fundraise and collect donations to provide gifts for the children and parents of this less fortunate families.
- Shower of Blessings: NU nursing students in community health have been working with St. Marks and NUSNA to provide a second shower event per month.
- Stand Down for Veterans: Two-tothree-day event providing services and supplies to homeless veterans, such as food, shelter, clothing, health screenings, court services, job interviews and VA social security benefits counseling.

Upcoming Events

Shower of Blessings

April 13 and May 10th 8 am

St. Mark's Church runs a program where they shower the homeless once a month, and provide breakfast, health education, health screening, and dignity bags. As part of Community Health, NU nursing students assist in this event and pledge funding and commitment to run a second shower event per month.

Campagnolo Gran Fondo

April 9th 7 am

NUSNA work closely with KOZ events to help provide medical aide volunteers when possible. Most of the volunteer opportunities provided come from KOZ. The Campagnolo Gran Fondo is a two-day event that culminates with a cycling race that rolls over San Diego, in 4 route options. We will be at the medical station at the Pio Pico rest stop.
