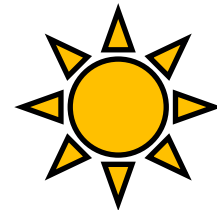
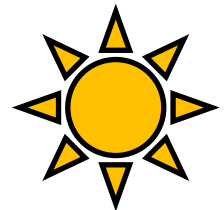
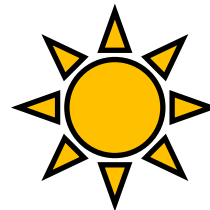
A message from Professor McLaughlin about the event:

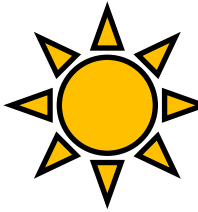
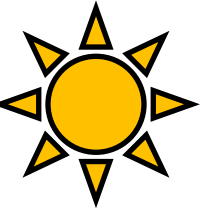

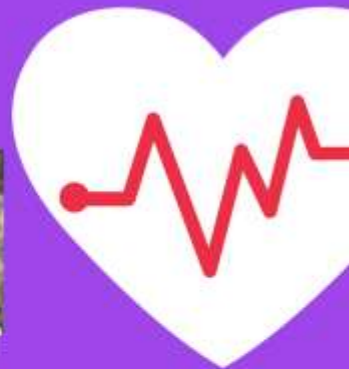
